#### **II. Cloze:**

(I) Almost a decade ago, California became the first state in the United States to ban single-use plastic bags. This was in an effort to tackle a(n) 24 plastic waste problem. Then came the reusable, heavy-duty plastic bags, offered to shoppers for 10 cents. Designed to withstand dozens of uses, and technically recyclable, many retailers treated them as exempt from the ban.

But because they didn't look much different from the <u>25</u> bags they replaced, lots of people didn't actually reuse them. And though they came <u>26</u> with a recycling symbol, it turned out that few, if any, actually were recycled.

The unhappy result: Last year, Californians threw away more plastic bags, by weight, than when the law first passed, according to figures from CalRecycle, California's recycling agency. Now, lawmakers are trying to fix that. A new bill seeks to ban all plastic bags offered at the checkout line, including the heavy duty kind. (Shoppers would still be able to pay for a paper bag.)

"It's time for us to get rid of plastic bags all together," said state Sen. Ben Allen, a Democrat and a sponsor of the bill. By some accounts, California's initial plastic bag ban was a well-meaning but failed experiment, an environmental rule that backfired and <u>27</u> made the matter worse. "We didn't worry about the carve-out for these thicker bags in the early days," said Mark Murray, director of Californians Against Waste, an advocacy group. "It just didn't seem like they were going to be the thing that they <u>28</u> became." Some advocates say the initial ban would have been effective if properly enforced. The ban, adopted in 2014, allowed for plastic bags to be sold to shoppers only if they were widely recycled in California. Daniel Conway of the California Grocers Association said retailers had "followed the letter of the law." He said he hoped new legislation would clear up any confusion that remained over the thicker bags. "We see this as finishing what we started," he said. "People are really starting to accept that they bring reusable bags with them when they go to the grocery store."

(Ⅱ) Authorities in Australia are currently investigating a tragic incident that occurred at a busy shopping mall in Sydney. The incident involved a lone attacker who <u>29</u> stabbed six people and injured several others, deliberately targeting women <u>30</u> men were avoided. The assailant, <u>31</u> as Joel Cauchi, was shot and killed by the police during the attack, which took place at the Westfield Bondi Junction mall near Bondi Beach. Terrorism has been ruled out by the police <u>32</u> Cauchi, a 40-year-old homeless individual, was revealed to have a history of mental illness.

Police Commissioner Karen Webb emphasized the importance of the videos as evidence and highlighted the investigation's focus on understanding why women were targeted. Andrew Cauchi, the attacker's father, explained that his son, who <u>33</u> schizophrenia, targeted women due to his desire for a girlfriend, lack of social skills, and extreme <u>34</u>. He described his son as severely ill. <u>35</u>, he revealed that his son had a strong interest in knives, prompting him <u>36</u> five U.S. military combat knives from his son while they were living together in their family home in Toowoomba last year. He feared that they could be used for violent purposes.

As a tribute to the victims, flags on government buildings across Australia are flying <u>37</u> halfstaff, and a national day of mourning has been declared. The Sydney Opera House will display a black ribbon as part of a light display in the evening. While the police returned control of the seven-story crime scene to the mall operators on Sunday night, it has not yet been <u>38</u> when the mall will reopen.

Recognizing that their behavior often stems from unresolved traumas or insecurities engenders a sense of compassion. #### V • Discourse Structure :

(I) Kyoto, a highly popular tourist destination known for its famous landmarks, is facing negative impacts on the lives of locals and the environment due to a significant increase in visitors. The recent surge in arrivals, both domestic and international, was previously restricted by the COVID-19 pandemic. <u>52</u> These challenges include issues like overcrowded public transportation, leading to social and cultural conflicts.

To tackle these problems, the city government implemented enhanced measures last autumn, just in time for the peak tourism season. <u>53</u> To achieve this, the government made strategic changes, including discontinuing the sale of one-day passes for buses within the city. Instead, they are promoting a \$1,000 one-day subway and bus pass that allows unlimited access to public transportation, including subway lines and buses operated by the city government and other bus companies.

Additionally, the city government is actively promoting the use of a park-and-ride system to reduce traffic congestion around tourist attractions. This system encourages visitors to park their private vehicles at designated lots and use public transportation to reach their destinations. 54 This involves encouraging visitors to avoid carrying large bags, including suitcases, which can exacerbate overcrowding on buses. The government revamped its dedicated website for empty-handed tourism, listing a significant number of businesses that offer temporary baggage storage services. 55 Through these comprehensive initiatives, Kyoto aims to preserve its cultural heritage, protect its natural surroundings, and ensure a positive and harmonious experience for both locals and tourists alike.

<u>57</u> Once introduced into the body, these nanoparticles disseminate synthetic chemicals, potentially dispersing harmful substances throughout various tissues and cells, experts caution. <u>58</u> A single liter of water, equivalent to two standard-sized bottles, contained an average of 240,000 plastic particles, predominantly composed of nanoplastics, along with microplastics. These minute plastic fragments, measuring less than 0.2 inches down to 1/25,000th of an inch, pose a pervasive threat.

Sherri "Sam" Mason, a sustainability expert at Penn State Behrend, lauded the study's rigor, hailing it as groundbreaking. Mason emphasizes the importance of heeding longstanding advice to opt for tap water stored in glass or stainless steel containers to mitigate exposure to plastics, extending this caution to all plastic-packaged consumables. <u>59</u> This technological breakthrough enables researchers to meticulously scrutinize, count, and analyze the chemical composition of these minute particles, previously concealed from scientific inquiry.

Despite the potential health risks posed by nanoplastics, there remains a dearth of research into their impacts, particularly on vulnerable populations such as infants and young children. Experts warn of the insidious nature of nanoplastic pollution, with particles infiltrating major organs and potentially disrupting vital cellular processes. <u>60</u> Questions regarding nanoplastic sources, distribution, and physiological impacts remain unanswered, underscoring the imperative for continued research and public awareness.

In the interim, individuals can take proactive measures to reduce plastic exposure, advocating for sustainable alternatives and mindful consumption practices. Amidst mounting concerns over nanoplastic contamination, informed choices and collective action are indispensable in safeguarding human health and environmental integrity.

Baseball prodigy Shohei Ohtani's trusted interpreter, Ippei Mizuhara, faces serious allegations from US authorities, accused of embezzling millions from the star athlete. In a press briefing held in Los Angeles on Thursday, US Attorney Martin Estrada revealed that Mr. Mizuhara stands accused of assuming Mr. Ohtani's identity to conduct illicit activities, including financial transactions and placing wagers. "Mr. Ohtani is a victim in this unfortunate situation," asserted Estrada.

The 39-year-old Mizuhara, dismissed from his position last month amid revelations of the purported misdeeds, allegedly utilized Ohtani's funds to fuel his penchant for unlawful sports betting. According to prosecutors, Mizuhara orchestrated unauthorized transfers totaling over \$16 million from Ohtani's account between November 2021 and January 2024. "This was driven by Mr. Mizuhara's relentless pursuit of illegal sports gambling," stated Estrada.

Court documents outline how Mizuhara, acting as Ohtani's de facto manager, capitalized on the language barrier between the Japanese sports star and English-speaking entities. By falsely representing himself as Ohtani, Mizuhara deceived bank personnel into greenlighting wire transfers from Ohtani's account to associates of the illicit gambling ring. In addition to the financial irregularities, Mizuhara purportedly squandered \$325,000 on baseball memorabilia from January to March 2024, using Ohtani's funds. Legal counsel for Mizuhara declined to comment on the charges.

In a recent interview with prosecutors, Ohtani disavowed any involvement in or knowledge of Mizuhara's illicit activities, offering his cellphone for scrutiny. Prosecutors corroborated Ohtani's assertion, finding no indication of his complicity. The gravity of the allegations against Mizuhara is underscored by the potential penalty of 30 years' imprisonment for bank fraud. Reports suggest ongoing negotiations for a plea agreement with prosecutors. While sports betting enjoys legality in 38 US states, it remains outlawed in California. Major League Baseball maintains strict policies prohibiting any involvement in betting activities, whether by players, officials, or staff.

Estrada clarified that there is no evidence implicating Mizuhara in wagers on baseball games. Ohtani, celebrated for his exceptional talent, inked a groundbreaking \$700 million deal with the Dodgers, solidifying his status as a sports icon. Mizuhara had been a constant presence since Ohtani's US debut in 2018. Speculation surrounding Ohtani's personal life intensified recently with the emergence of a photo featuring Mizuhara and his spouse alongside Ohtani's wife, Mamiko Tanaka. Expressing dismay over Mizuhara's alleged betrayal, Ohtani lamented, "I'm deeply saddened and shocked by the actions of someone I trusted. Ippei has deceived me and stolen from my accounts," conveyed through a different interpreter during a Dodgers press event last month.
